Stargazing

Galloway Forest Park is Europe's second Dark Sky Park, and the first of its kind in the UK. Dark Sky Parks are places which experience low or practically non-existent levels of light pollution, revealing ink-black skies filled with dazzling stars.

We run stargazing weekends here at The Selkirk Arms that include talks and trips to the new Dark Sky Planetarium in Kirkcudbright and the Galloway Dark Sky Park. We are joined by top Scottish Astronomer Steve Owens of the Glasgow Science Centre for a fascinating insight into our night skies.




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
