...known as the 'Artist's Town' because so many well known Scottish artists have lived and worked here, Kirkcudbright offers the visitor a wide range of activities.

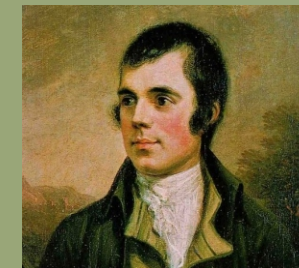
Visit the numerous art galleries and the Tollbooth Art Centre where the story of the town's artists is told.
